URC Holiday Forum 2024 is a space to cook up some ideas, with Salty stories to draw out the diverse flavours of love in our world and Yeasty characters to swell our perception and raise hope. In Matthew 13:31-33, Jesus describes the Kingdom of God to be like seeds and yeast. Seeds and Yeast are transformed as they bring transformation to the world around them. Encounters with difference and openness to difference are two of the processes which can enable this transformation in people. Sharing some of our encounters and reflecting on Bible stories, I hope we can taste together God's transformation in our lives and world."

Fiona will give a talk each morning on the theme and will also run a discussion group based on the talks after morning coffee. These sessions will encourage participants to reflect and challenge each other and really dig deep into the theme.

# **First Aid**

Anyone requiring First Aid, please contact a Duty Elder. If there are no Duty Elders available, please go to the main reception at The Hayes. Anyone who's had a medical condition requiring treatment in the fortnight preceding Forum should advise on arrival. Anyone able to provide First Aid help, please advise on the questionnaire above, or on arrival.

In case of an emergency please follow the procedure given by The Hayes and call Fi (07913 817988) or Cathy (07722174562) on their mobile to make them aware.

# Going offsite and day visitors

For fire regulation purposes, if you go off site at any point during the week for any reason, please sign out on the list on the desk in main reception.

If you are expecting visitors any day, please let Cathy Heath (Bookings Secretary) know as early as possible so that necessary arrangements can be made with the Hayes. A charge is made for visitors which must be paid in advance.

#### **Children and Young People**

We are lucky to have URC children's and youth workers to run the CYP activities again this year. It is important that we have a duty of care to all at Holiday Forum, especially in providing children's workshops to ensure their safety and wellbeing.
